Dear IACTE Members,

On behalf of the 2009-2010 IACTE Executive Committee, I want to welcome you back to another great semester for Teacher Education in Iowa. It has been my honor to serve as your president. We eagerly await the results of the first round of awards, knowing the great implications and change that will come about as a result of Iowa's success with this grant. It is my hope that higher education, specifically teacher education faculty, will continue to be a strong resource for the State as it rolls out and institutes the innovation contained within the grant. Know that IACTE will be especially vigilant as the State begins to establish systems linking student performance to teacher performance, and ultimately to institutions of higher education.

Just two weeks ago, I attended the AACTE annual conference in Atlanta and represented Iowa at the ACSR (Advisory Council of State Representatives) meeting along with Past-President Dave Whaley (ACSR Midwest region chair). Our meeting focused heavily on the changes in funding streams from the US Department of Education, noting Secretary Duncan's push for innovation and competition. While his office has increased total funding available under the ESEA, it has also opened the door to those who can compete for such funding. It is imperative that our programs remain aware of these changes and the implications that they hold for not only our programs, but for teacher preparation in the State of Iowa as a whole.

All of this work, of course, leads us to the spring 2010 IACTE meeting at Central College in Pella. Let's hope that the snow is gone and the tulips are popping up by the time April 8-9<sup>th</sup> roll around. You can find conference details on the newly renovated IACTE webpage. Our spring conference is packed full of opportunities for you to continue looking forward into teacher preparation in the state of Iowa and at your respective institutions. I'm very excited to announce that Jane West, the Vice President of Policy, Programs and Professional Issues at AACTE will be our keynote speaker early on Friday, April 9<sup>th</sup>. As we look at the changing landscape of teacher preparation in Iowa, Jane West will examine with us new policy initiatives from the US Dept of Education impacting teacher preparation.

In addition to Jane West, we have a variety of sessions that I hope will address your staff development needs. We'll have staff development as it relates to the new children's literature text sets that Arlie purchased for all of our programs. Attend the aMaze session and share with colleagues how you are using or plan to use this wonderful resource. We'll also have an opportunity for you to explore the latest technologies available for the higher education classroom and how such technologies can be used to advance the teacher education candidate. Finally, we'll have our very own peers from Graceland University share with us how to design, implement, and maintain a quality unit assessment system. Please see the conference schedule for details.
